FOR BEST PERFORMANCE

Before You Start

1. Hand wash the Flipwich™ thoroughly.
2. To season, spread a light coating of vegetable oil over the inside grill plates of the Flipwich™. Close and lock with the handle clip.
3. Place the Flipwich™ onto your stove top and turn the heat to medium. Limit heat to the induction plate area. (Figure 1)
4. Watch carefully and remove the Flipwich™ from the burner once the oil begins to smoke.
5. Let it cool down completely.
6. Wipe away excess oil with a soft cloth or paper towel
7. Repeat on the other grill plate of the Flipwich™, so that both sides are seasoned.

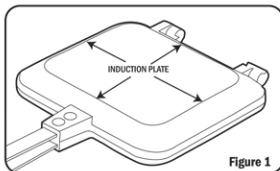
